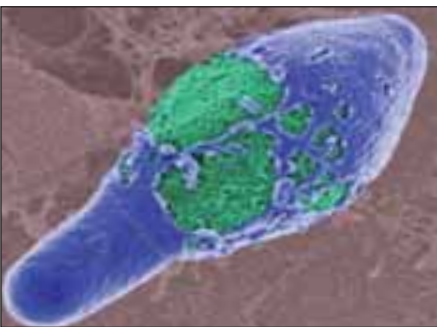
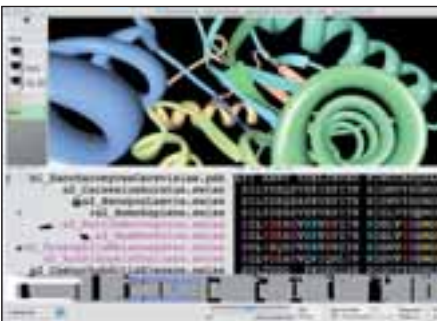




Is there a black sheep working in your lab? An ever-increasing number of scientific misconduct cases rock the world of science. (p. 24-27)
